
AFRICAN-AMERICAN MATHEMATICIANS




Archie Alexander 1888 - 1958

Archie Alexander was an African-American mathematician and engineer. He became governor of the U.S. Virgin Islands.




Benjamin Banneker 1731 - 1806

Benjamin Banneker was a black American who is best-known for his Astronomical Almanac.




Charles Bernard Bell 1928 - 2010

Charles Bernard Bell Jr was an African American whose specialties were nonparametric statistics, stochastic processes, and related areas. He was professor of Mathematical Sciences at San Diego State University.




Albert Bharucha-Reid 1927 - 1985

Albert Bharucha-Reid was an American mathematician who worked on probability theory, Markov chains, and statistics.



David Blackwell 1919 - 2010

David Blackwell was an American statistician and mathematician who worked in game theory, probability theory, information theory and Bayesian statistics. He was the first African-American member of the US National Academy of Sciences.




Edward Bouchet 1852 - 1918


Edward Bouchet was an American physicist and educator and was the first African American to earn a Ph.D. from an American university.
















Marjorie Lee Browne 1914 - 1979

Marjorie Lee Browne was an American mathematical educator. She was one of the first African-American women to receive a Ph.D.



1920 - 2016

George Hench Butcher Jr was one of the first twenty African American to be awarded a Ph.D. in mathematics. Awarded his Ph.D. by University of Pennsylvania, he taught at Howard University for 39 years.



Schieffelin Claytor 1908 - 1967

Schieffelin Claytor was an American mathematician specialising in topology.

Elbert Cox 1895 - 1969

Elbert Frank Cox was an American mathematician and was the first African American to receive a PhD in Mathematics.



1905 - 1977

Joseph James Dennis was the eleventh African American to be awarded a Ph.D. in mathematics. He served as the chair of the department of mathematics at Clark College from 1930 to 1974.

Wade Ellis 1909 - 1989

Wade Ellis Sr was the twelfth African American to be awarded a Ph.D. in mathematics. He worked on radar and was a professor at Oberlin College in Oberlin, Ohio.




Etta Zuber Falconer 1933 - 2002

Etta Zuber Falconer was an American mathematician and educator. She was one of the earlier African-American women to receive a Ph.D. in mathematics.




Israel Everett Glover 1913 - 1975

Israel Everett Glover was the first African American to be awarded a Ph.D. in mathematics by Oklahoma State University. He was appointed as Chairman of the Department of Mathematics at Florida A & M University in Tallahassee, Florida.



Edray Herber Goins 1972 -

Edray Herber Goins is an American mathematician who does research in algebraic geometry.



Eugene Alexander Graham 1925 - 1997

Eugene Alexander Graham Jr was awarded the Silver Star for gallantry in the Italian campaign of World War II. He was the first African American to study for a Ph.D. in mathematics outside the United States. He spent most of his career in France.



Evelyn Boyd Granville 1924 -

Evelyn Boyd Granville was only the second African-American woman to receive a PhD in mathematics from an American University. She worked in computing.




Euphemia Lofton Haynes 1890 - 1980

Euphemia Lofton Haynes was an American mathematician and educator. She was the first African-American woman to earn a PhD in mathematics.













Gloria Hewitt 1935 -

Gloria Hewitt is an American mathematician who undertook research in algebra. She became the first African American woman to chair a university mathematics department in the United States.

Elgy Sibley Johnson 1912 - 1987

Elgy Sibley Johnson was an African American mathematician who was awarded a Ph.D. by the Catholic University of America. He served at the District of Columbia Teachers College, then joined the University of the District of Columbia when it was founded in 1976.



Katherine Johnson 1918 - 2020

Katherine Johnson was an African-American mathematician who made contributions to NASA's space programmme. She was featured in the 2017 film Hidden figures.



John Quill Taylor King 1921 - 2011

John Quill Taylor King was an African American mathematician who was awarded a Ph.D. by the University of Texas. He was a professor of mathematics at Samuel Huston College and was President of Tillotson College for over twenty years.




Joshua Allensworth Leslie 1933 -

Joshua Allensworth Leslie was an African American mathematician born in Jamaica. He studied for his Ph.D. at the University of Paris advised by Henri Cartan. He was a professor at the University of Ibadan in Nigeria, Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois, and Howard University.

Vivienne Malone-Mayes 1932 - 1995

Vivienne Malone-Mayes was an American mathematician and educationalist.




Walter Samuel McAfee 1914 - 1995

Walter McAfee was an African-American scientist and astronomer, best known for his part in the world's first lunar radar echo experiments.



Reuben R McDaniel 1902 - 1975

Reuben R McDaniel was the fifth African American to be awarded a Ph.D. in mathematics. He served most of his career at Virginia State College (now Virginia State University), as head of mathematics, then as Director of the School of Arts and Sciences.



Kelly Miller 1863 - 1939

Kelly Miller was an African-American mathematician, sociologist, essayist, newspaper columnist and author.




Luna Isaac Mishoe 1917 - 1989

Luna Isaac Mishoe was one of the first twenty African American to be awarded a Ph.D. in mathematics. He did postdoctoral research at Oxford University in England and from 1960 served as president of Delaware State College.



Joseph Pierce 1902 - 1969

Joseph Pierce was the sixth African American to be awarded a Ph.D. in mathematics. He taught mathematics in universities for most of his career, undertook research in statistics, and is most famed for the classic book Negro Business and Business *Education* (1947).



Abdulalim Abdullah Shabazz 1927 - 2014

Lonnie Grafton Cross was an African American mathematician who took the name Abdulalim Abdullah Shabazz. He was awarded the Mentor Award of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and the Presidential Award for Excellence in Science, Mathematics and Engineering Mentoring.















Beauregard Stubblefield 1923 - 2013

Beauregard Stubblefield was an African American mathematician who, despite his excellent undergraduate record, was turned down for graduate work at several universities. He showed great determination and eventually was awarded a Ph.D. from the University of Michigan.


Walter R Talbot 1909 - 1977

Walter R Talbot was an American mathematician who worked in group theory. He was the fourth African American to earn a Ph.D. in Mathematics.




Talitha Washington 1974 -

Talitha Washington is an American mathematician who, in 2001, became the first African American to graduate with a doctorate in mathematics from the University of Connecticut. She won the 2019 Black Engineer of the Year STEM Innovator Award.



J Ernest Wilkins 1923 - 2011

Ernest Wilkins was an African-American mathematician and nuclear scientist. He worked on various pure mathematical topics as well as researching in nuclear engineering and optics.



Lloyd Kenneth Williams 1925 - 2001

Lloyd Kenneth Williams was an African American mathematician who studied for his doctorate at University of California at Berkeley. He ended his career at Texas Southern University in Houston.



Dudley Woodard 1881 - 1965

Dudley Woodard was an American mathematician and educator who was the second African-American to earn a PhD in Mathematics.
